For Students Entering 5th Grade in 2026-2027

Dear Parents and Students,

Summer learning for 5th grade is separated into three components: A novel with a test, IXL assignments, and I-Ready Assignments. The details are as follows:

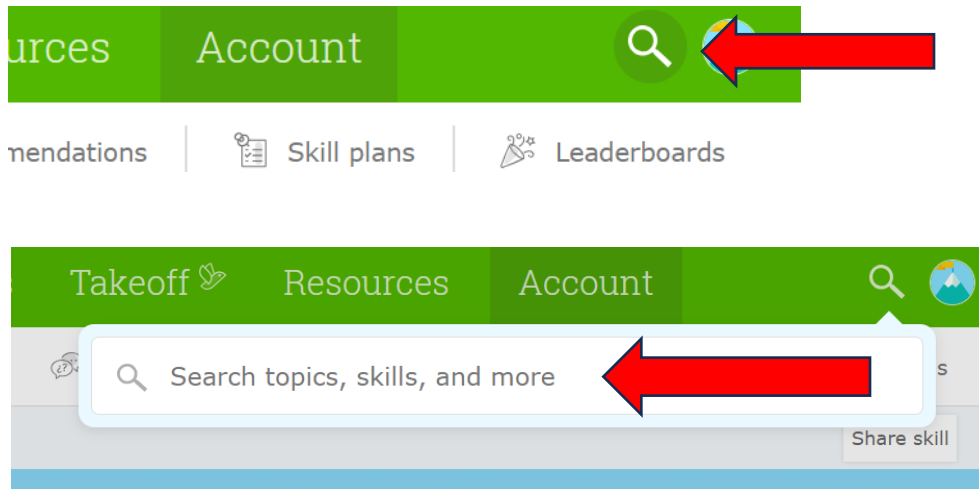
1. Students need to read *Matilda by Roald Dahl*. They will need to be prepared to take a test on their book on Thursday, August 13th.
2. I-Ready-
 - Students will complete 5 passed lessons of I-Ready in Reading and 5 passed I-Ready lessons in Math.
 - These will be due on Monday, July 20th. This is a strict deadline because the I-Ready program will close for the summer after this. All lessons must be completed to receive a 100% test grade. Each completed I-Ready is worth 20% of that test grade. Please ensure that all are completed by the deadline to receive full credit.
3. IXLs-
 - Students are required to complete assigned IXLs for Math and Language Arts (listed below).
 - All IXLs must reach 100.
 - A chart with IXLs is included in this packet.
 - IXLs are due no later than Monday, August 3rd. Points will be deducted for late work.

Reminder of Important Due Dates:

1. I-Ready is due Monday, July 20th
2. IXLs are due Monday, August 3rd
3. Summer book test Thursday, August 13th.

Students are to complete 5th grade IXLs:

Search Letters	IXL Topic
BDX	Add decimal numbers
SC8	Subtract decimal numbers
TDG	Multiply two decimals: products up to thousandths
XDZ	Divide decimals by whole numbers without adding zeros
VFX	Add, subtract, multiply, and divide fractions and mixed numbers
